SUPPLEMENT TO MOTION OF WRIGHT & SCHULTE, LLC ON BEHALF OF ITSELF AND ITS CLIENTS AS WELL AS ASSOCIATED FIRMS FOR AWARD OF ATTORNEY FEES AND REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS

MEMORANDUM

Wright & Schulte, LLC by itself and jointly with other law firms (collectively, "WS Law" or the "Firm"), submits this Supplement on behalf of the Firm and the Firm's clients (the "WS Plaintiffs") (collectively, "Movants"), pursuant to MDL Court's Order Preliminarily approving the class action settlement in this case and dated April 10, 2018 [Doc. 2591] and Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23 to supplement its previously submitted Motion for Award of Attorneys' Fees and Reimbursement of Costs (the "WS Fee Motion") in both the District Court of Kansas and in Minnesota State Court actions. The Firm was one of many such petitioners who filed similar motions for fees. On July 18, 2018, the District Court of Kansas issued an "Order

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Regarding Attorney Fee Submissions" (the "Order") which requires, in relevant part, that Petitioners (such as this Firm) supplement their respective fee petitions with a fee and expense form created by the Court. Movants are filing this pleading in the District Court of Kansas and in Minnesota State Court since the Firm also filed the initial WS Fee Motion previously in both Courts.

Attached as Exhibit 1 to this Supplement is the PDF version of the spreadsheet required by the Court. Consistent with the Order, Movants have submitted the native Excel version of this spreadsheet by email to the Special Masters. Movants further note that the attached is a summary, only, of the hourly time submitted to the Court in the previously filed WS Fee Motion. Accordingly, it does not include the Firm's 110 hours spent preparing the Petition and all attachments. It also does not include time assisting clients with settlement paperwork since the Firm's previous filing of the WS Fee Motion; and, of course, it does not include the hundreds of hours the Firm expects to spend assisting clients with settlement paperwork until the claim submission process is complete.

In addition to the provision of this spreadsheet, Movants note the following. First, Plaintiffs discussed their contingent fee contracts in the previous WS Fee Motion indicating that the fees range from thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%) to forty percent (40%) plus expenses. *See*, e.g., p. 9. As noted in footnote 2 of the previous WS Fee Motion, these agreements are available for inspection by the Court. Also, if the Court requests it, the Firm can provide a listing of the precise terms of each fee agreement. The overwhelming majority of the fee contracts range between thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%) to thirty-five percent (35%) plus expenses with a combined fee and expense cap of forty percent (40%).

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Second, as explained in footnote 3 of its previous Motion, the Firm previously submitted common benefit ("CB") time to Plaintiffs' leadership for presentation to the Court and respectfully requests compensation for same. All CB time submitted is for work on Plaintiff Fact Sheets ("PFS"). The Firm notes this submission was made pursuant to a request from Plaintiffs' leadership, and it appears Leadership has submitted such time to the Court.

Because the Firm does not know the extent to which this Court may approve all or part of its CB fee request, the Firm submitted itemized hourly fees that included all CB and non-CB work with the previous WS Fee Motion (and in the attached spreadsheet). Of course (and as also explained in footnote 3 of its previous Motion), if the Firm is ultimately compensated for non-CB work on an hourly basis, it agrees that any approved CB hourly fee should not be paid again as non-CB hourly fee. To the extent the Court may need to make such a calculation, the Firm's submitted Common Benefit time solely consists of PFS preparation/review which is the following line item of the attached spreadsheet:

The Court may apply this fee data against the Firm's total fee submission, if necessary.

To conclude, Movants request payment of the Firm's fees and expenses as requested in its Motion. Further, Movants reserve the right to further supplement its Motion and (consistent with the Order) file a reply to any response to the filed fee motions to further support Petitioners' position, including but not limited to, discussion of Movants' entitlement to fees as a signatory to certain Joint Prosecution Agreements ("JPA") in this matter and discussed in the WS Fee Motion and other firms' fee petitions.
